

# Castles & Fortresses

The Guttland is the region of castles and fortresses. Nowhere else in Luxembourg is there such a high concentration of medieval buildings as here. Besides individual fortresses, such as the one in Useldange or Pettingen, the Valley of the Seven Castles is one of the country's main tourist attractions. The valley boasts the Mersch, Schoenfels, Ansembourg and Koerich castles as well as the Hollenfels fortress and the private Ansembourg and Septfontaines fortresses. The old structures of the Guttland region have survived down to the present day and are regularly filled with life during festivals and markets.

## Ansembourg Castle

The Grand-Château d'Ansembourg was built from 1639 onwards by Thomas Bidard, a pioneer in the iron and steel industry. In the 18th century, the castle underwent a significant change when Thomas Bidard's heirs received a knighthood to the rank of barons in 1728, and then to the rank of Earls of the Holy Roman Empire. The gardens were laid out from 1730 onwards, with statues, staircases and decorative fountains in the style of the gardens of the period (see page 72). Some areas can be rented.

## Hollenfels Castle

On a rocky outcrop at a height of 315 meters, Hollenfels Castle looks over the Eisch Valley. Hollenfels belongs to the Valley of the Seven Castles and captivates with its 40 metre high keep. A stone bridge spans the moat. Today, the site hosts a youth hostel and an SNJ youth centre dedicated to environmental education. The "Melting Pot" restaurant is located in the youth hostel. The castle is currently being restored.

## Koerich Castle

One of the most typical lowland castles of Luxembourg is nestled in the small valley of the Goeblange stream. With its mighty fortified tower, also known as the witches' tower, and its outer walls in late Romanesque style, the castle forms a remarkable unit together with the Baroque church and the old houses of the village. Wirich I, Lord of Koerich and steward of Luxembourg, had the castle built at the end of the 12th century. In the 14th century, Gilles d'Autel-Koerich added a Gothic residential building and two towers on the south façade. The first conservation works on the castle began in 1995, and were completed in the autumn of 2019. The ruin can be visited through a barrier-free access

## Mersch Castle

In the year 1232 Theodorich I burst on to the scene. The first Lord of Mersch was a knight and vassal, thus head of the court administration of Countess Ermesinde. He built a castle in what today is the centre of Mersch. The castle was repeatedly attacked over the centuries, for example by Burgundian troops, who set it on fire. Towards the end of the 16th century, Paulus von der Veltz had the medieval castle rebuilt into a comfortable manorial abode. The former castle chapel houses a small castle museum (see page 33). Today the castle is the seat of the municipal administration.

## Schoenfels Castle

Frederic of Schoenfels aka "Ferri" built a fortified court in Schoenfels in 1292. An imposing 21-metre high fortified and residential tower was erected. The keep was rebuilt more often over the centuries. In the 19th century the castle was given a neo-Gothic makeover, the windows were enlarged and roof structures were added. Currently, the English gardens from 1820 and the tower are being restored.

## Pettingen Castle

The remaining walls give the impression that a mighty castle must have stood here once. Pettingen Castle has its origins in a fortress built in the 10th century. The moat, which once protected the inhabitants from intruders, is 15 meters wide. The names of the Lords of Pettingen are linked to all important events in Luxembourg in the Middle Ages - for example the wedding of Ermesinde, the accession of Henry IV to the throne, the marriage contract of Count John the Blind. The castle in Pettingen is one of the best preserved moated castles in the country.

## Useldange Castle

The estate of Useldange came into being by division of inheritance ca. 1100. The first owners of Useldange Fortress were probably Theobald of Useldange and his wife Azeka. The castle and chapel suffered severe damage in the 15th century. Later the fortress decayed visibly. In 1924 Francis Kuhn-Wolff acquired the fortress ruins. Instead of the gate she had a villa built, which today serves as the town hall. A cultural path for the visually impaired was laid out around the fortress, under the patronage of UNESCO to present the local cultural heritage in its historical form. This path is designed to enable the visually impaired to feel, hear and smell history.

## Mill of Beckerich

The old craft lives and revives the mill in Beckerich. A specially made water wheel has recently been turning at full speed again. Immerse yourself in a world of the past with insights into the old craft of the master millers or carpenters. This project is run by the wise "Millepätteren" (Mill godfathers), who share their valuable knowledge with you with enthusiasm.

## Pottery Museum

Nospelt was the centre of the Luxembourg pottery from 1458 to 1914. A museum was finally established in the last potter's house where visitors are initiated into the secrets of this old craft and can admire old pottery. Nospelt is best known for the "Emaischen" folk festival on Easter weekend, where everything revolves around the "Péckvillercher" - pipes fired from clay in the shape of a bird - which simply could not be missing in the pottery museum.

## Michel Lucius Museum

The famous Luxembourg geologist Dr Michel Lucius was born in Reimberg in 1876 into a working class family. Through his father's profession, who worked in the Mertziger quarry, Lucius came into contact with geology at an early age. # Historical Sites

The Guttland region is home to many prehistoric and ancient sites as well as Gallo-Roman sites, such as the Roman villa in Mersch, the thermal baths in Mamer or the villa in Goeblange. The Villa Rustica in Goeblange "Miecher" is a larger Gallo-Roman estate in the Treverian region. If you are fascinated by the Stone Age, you can take a look at the Neolithic village in Blaschette or at the impressive menhir in Mersch.

### Roman Villa

The Villa Rustica was a larger Gallo-Roman estate on the territory of the Celtic tribe of Treveri. It was built in the early 1st century and covers a walled area of seven hectares, on which at least 13 stone buildings stood. In addition to the luxurious manor house, two other residential buildings, a small temple and three outbuildings completed the picture. Even if only the foundations are preserved today, it is easy to imagine how magnificent the complex must have been. The knowledge gained proves that people from the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages had already left their mark on this place.

## Raschpëtzer

The "Raschpëtzer"-Qanat in Helmsange Forest is an underground aqueduct system for supplying drinking water to the former Roman settlement area in today's municipalities of Walferdange and Steinsel. The system was built around 130 AD. The technology of the Qanat (the underground water supply through the construction of tunnels and shafts) actually originates from the desert areas of Iran. With a length of 700 meters and a maximum depth of 36 meters, the plant still has a capacity of 180 cubic meters of drinking water per day despite its very old age. The building is an important relic of Roman engineering.

# Gallo-Roman Thermal Baths

The Roman thermal baths were discovered in 1972 during archaeological excavations near the "Tossebierg", together with the remains of other buildings from the Roman period. The walls of the thermal baths were reconstructed up to a height of 50 centimetres. Upon request, visitors can also see an actor playing a Roman, who tells the history and legends of the Gallo-Roman era. He explains the architecture with its different rooms and the advantages of the Roman baths. Maps and historical objects are used during the tour to illustrate this journey through time.

# Roman Villa

The Gallo-Roman Villa Rustica in Mersch was once a magnificent property, 200 metres long and 65 metres wide. The mansion even had underfloor heating (hypocaust). The covered remains are still well preserved and can be visited. There was an oval swimming pool 75 metres long and 6.50 metres wide next to the mansion. The hollow is still visible and accessible. # Roman Mosaic

The municipality of Vichten gained a certain notoriety through the discovery of a Roman mosaic in 1995 depicting Homer within a circle of the nine muses. The mosaic, which was created around 240 A.D., shows the muses in the order determined by Hesiod around 700 BC. The mosaic was created in a workshop in Trier and covered the floor of the reception hall of a Gallo-Roman villa. A copy of the mosaic can be found between the church and the community centre

# Neolithic House

Numerous chapels and churches in the Guttland attest to the religious heritage through the long Christian tradition of Luxembourg. # Kuelebierg

The origins of the Holy Cross Chapel can be traced back to the Middle Ages. It is perched on Kuelebierg Hill in Beckerich and is dedicated to the Holy Cross. A 700 metre long Way of the Cross leads from the church in Beckerich up to the chapel. The chapel is a special gem, thanks to the secluded location, peaceful atmosphere and the architecture and history. It was listed as a national monument in 2019.

# Helperknapp

On Helperknapp Hill, a spring issues in a small chapel. It is called Willibrord Chapel because of the statue of Willibrord nearby. It is assumed that the spring was already used for religious purposes in Gallo-Roman times. 40 metres farther is the so-called Gehaans Chapel. Helperknapp was already a place of pilgrimage in the Middle Ages. The "Helpermaart", still one of the largest markets in the region today, was held there every year.

The St. Anne's Chapel (1505), one of the oldest in the country, offers a breathtaking view from its hilly location. Not only does it have great historical value, but its artistic quality also makes it an important testimony to the heritage handed down by the Benedictines. The altar originally came from Neumünster Abbey, clues to which can be found in the existing Forting family coat of arms. Benoît Fortin was abbot there from 1717 to 1743 and probably commissioned the altar. The central oil painting, signed by Pierre Maisonet (1750-1827), is a copy of a painting by the Venetian Giovanni Battista Pittoni.

# St. Rémy Church

Angels with golden wings crouch on the columns above the altar and blow trumpets. The church in Koerich is considered one of the most magnificent baroque churches in the country. The confessionals are carved in wood. In addition, there is the impressive altar and the paintings by the artist Emmerich Millim. In 1748 the church was built on the foundations of a small medieval church from 1200 - with the help of the personal fortune of Father Jean-Pierre Ningels. Perched on a hill above the village, the church underwent extensive restoration between 1991 and 1993.

# Marienthal Monastery

Founded in the 13th century, Marienthal was originally a poor monastery. This changed in 1258 with the arrival of Yolanda of Vianden. Marienthal experienced an upswing through various donations to Luxembourg by the Counts of Vianden. Yolanda had a library established and promoted the economic and cultural life of the monastery. During the Thirty Years' War, the monastery was gradually abandoned and finally dissolved in 1783. The building provided accommodation for many refugees during World War II. Today the Service National de la Jeunesse (SNJ) runs a youth education centre there.

# Parish Church

The church at Michelsplatz in Mersch was demolished when it became dilapidated. The only remnant of the former parish church is the Saint Michael's Tower on the market square. The three- nave deanery church was built in late classicist style from 1844 to 1850. This architectural trend is rather rare in Luxembourg for ecclesiastical buildings. It can be recognized by the Doric columns in front of the entrance, which are strongly reminiscent of ancient, mainly Greek models. The interior of the church was painted in 1936 by Father Notker Becker from the Maria Laach Abbey.

# Eenelter Chapel

A chapel has stood on this site in Reckange since early Christian times. The chapel was first mentioned in a document in 1180. The right to hold markets was already in force at the time, making this one of the oldest markets in Luxembourg. In 1751 a new chapel was consecrated. It fell into disrepair during the French Revolution. The furnishings were sold. The present chapel was built in 1897 in honour of St. Donatus and Theobald on a hill not far from the menhir, which overlooks Mersch.

# St. Willibrord Church

The Willibrord Church in Rindschleiden is one of the oldest and most beautiful churches in the country. It is known for its colourful 15th and 16th century frescoes on an area of 170 m² which depict scenes from the Old and New Testament. The main altar with its carving and important religious figures is also remarkable. Originally, the church was built in the 10th century in honour of all the saints. In the 16th century it was then consecrated to St. Willibrord. From its initial size of 50 m², it has been extended several times over the centuries, as can be clearly gauged today through the different architectural styles.

# Romanesque Church

The Romanesque church in Saeul is thought to have been built in the 12th century. It was first mentioned in a document in 1318. In the 1960s, the church was completely restored in the style of that time. The church was built to a very simple design and the building materials were clearly emphasized. # Trinity Church

The church of Walferdange was built from 1845 to 1852 in the neoclassical style church and dedicated to the Holy Trinity. St. George is the secondary patron saint. It was consecrated in 1867 by the apostolic vicar Nikolaus Adames. Two niches in the neoclassical front are decorated with contemporary statues of Saint Maximilian Kolbe and Saint Theresa of Lisieux. Remarkable features in the interior include the side altars and the statues of St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Francis Xavier, which come from the Cathedral of Luxembourg, but above all the magnificent wall paintings by Gerhard Lamers from 1903. They were restored with great care in 2011.


